Year 1	<p>Literacy - Hamilton and National Curriculum In English the children will be continuing to develop their writing and spelling skills. We will be focusing on storytelling, story writing, non-fiction work and poetry. Children will be expected to continue learning spellings; these will consist of high frequency words. The children will be continuing to build on their phonetic knowledge through a range of digraphs. They will also be practising their handwriting skills and will be heard for guided reading as a group.</p> <p>Maths - Maths Mastery and National Curriculum Children will be learning counting skills with importance given to one to one correspondence as this is essential to progress in maths. They will also be securing number facts through comparing objects and looking at number bonds to 10. The children will also be exposed to rich tasks which will develop their mathematical skills. The mathematical vocabulary introduced to the children is very important and children should be encouraged to explore this at home.</p> <p>Science - (Planit) and National Curriculum This term the children will develop their knowledge about the plant's parts, animal babies and food chains, uses of materials and comparing, recording and concluding weather observations.</p> <p>Geography - Passport around the World The unit will encourage the development of knowledge about places and their locations. The range of activities is designed to ensure that, over time, children learn about places, where the places are and how they are connected. Linked to Rugby World Cup in 2015.</p>	<p>Literacy - Hamilton and National Curriculum In English the children will be continuing to develop their writing and spelling skills. We will be focusing on drama, story writing, instructions and poetry. Children will be expected to continue learning spellings based on phonic sounds. The children will be introduced to alien words too. The children will be continuing to build on their phonetic knowledge through a range of digraphs. They will also be practising their handwriting skills and will be heard for guided reading as a group.</p> <p>Maths - Maths Mastery and National Curriculum The children will be exposed to rich tasks which will develop their mathematical skills and language through maths mastery. Children will be continuing to secure 1:1 correspondence through counting and comparing different sets of objects to 40 and time. The mathematical vocabulary introduced to the children is very important and children should be encouraged to explore this at home.</p> <p>Science - (Planit) and National Curriculum The children will learn about the environment, habitats, body parts and exploring materials. We will be specifically looking at different types of trees, while exploring seasonal changes, using the senses for observation and investigations. During the second half of term, in Geography the children will be transforming into polar explorers. They will be learning about the world's continents and oceans. They will be finding out what life is like in the polar regions.</p> <p>Geography - Around the school The children will be developing mapping skills and get used to following instructions. They also explore local human and physical features located around the school.</p>	<p>Literacy - Hamilton and National Curriculum In English the children will be continuing to develop their writing and spelling skills. We will be focusing on storytelling, story writing, non-fiction work and poetry. Children will be expected to continue learning spellings; these will consist of high frequency words. The children will be continuing to build on their phonetic knowledge through a range of digraphs. They will also be practising their handwriting skills and will be heard for guided reading as a group.</p> <p>Maths - Maths Mastery and National Curriculum Children will be learning about shapes and place value as well as calculation and handling data and measures. The children will also be engaging in problem solving and securing number facts. Children will be using mathematical vocabulary and giving reasons for their answers.</p> <p>Science - (Planit) and National Curriculum We will be looking at various topics throughout the summer term. Plants - parts of a plant, difference in plants and consolidating previous learning. Seasonal changes - light - looking at light sources and how shadows are created. Animals - looking at the difference in animals, invertebrates, etc. Materials - investigating what is the best use for materials and designing a product.</p> <p>Geography - Barnaby Bear UK In Geography the children will be exploring the UK along with Barnaby bear. They will get an insight into different countries in the UK. To understand compass points North, South, East and West. Basic mapping skills to be developed.</p>

History - Toys changes within memory

The children will be learning about toys across time. Using 'before', 'after', 'past', 'present', 'then' and 'now'. To know and understand History as a chronological narrative. They will look at the different toys through the ages, based on what materials people had at that particular time

Art - Portraits

In autumn term the children will be looking at various artists and developing their sketching and painting skills while focusing on the topic of portraits.

DT - Moving Pictures

In D&T the children will be looking at moving pictures. This will have a cross curricular link with RE making Christmas cards and tree toppers.

RE - Come and See

During the autumn terms, in RE the children are going to be learning about God's World, looking after God's World and the story of Noah's Ark. This will be taught through discussing the creation story and thinking about ways we can look after the world. Through this children can begin to think of how special the world is around us and how we should be thankful for the beautiful world we live in.

PE - Team Games/Gymnastics

Year 1 will be taking part in games based activities in order to show understanding of rules within a game. Year 1 will be adapting these games to apply different ball skills such as bouncing, throwing and catching. Year 1 will also be working in teams and improving their teamwork and tactics in order to win. Gym coach to continue with Gym Steps to track and monitor progress of gymnastic skills.

Languages- French (Planit)

Basic greetings and songs in French

History - Significant historical events

Compare the Monarchy from today and in the past. Looking at similarities and differences.

Art - Materials

In Art the children will be investigating a variety of materials, exploring man-made and natural materials and their uses. They will also be developing their weaving skills and looking at textiles.

DT - Playgrounds

In D&T the children will be looking at playgrounds and use different materials to make their own playgrounds - they will visit local playground and evaluate which equipment is best suited to which age group.

RE - Come and See

During the Spring terms, in RE the children are going to be learning about families and celebrations. This will be taught via the first sacrament, baptism. We will be moving onto learning about following Jesus and the Easter story.

PE - Team games

Year 1 will start with football skills and teamwork games, and move into striking and fielding skills. To continue working in teams and improving their teamwork and tactics in order to win.

Languages- French (Planit)

Basic greetings and songs in French

Music - Singing a key focus.

We will be singing a variety of topic based songs adding tuned and un-tuned percussion instruments. The children will further develop their performing, composing and listening skills through their songs and their understanding of the key elements of music, focusing on pitch, rhythm, pulse and dynamics. We will also introduce tempo into their music.

History—Events beyond living memory

The River Thames and The Tower of London. To explore and understand the significance of these places and the role they play in past and present life.

Art - Sculpture

In summer term 1 in Art the children will be creating sculptures out of a range of materials and will progress to making sculptures out of clay for their final piece.

DT - Homes

In D&T the children will be looking at homes and use different materials to make their own homes linking to the past and present.

RE - Come and See

During the summer terms, in RE the children are going to be learning about the Resurrection and Miracles. This will be taught through discussing why Jesus appeared to the disciples and reading the stories about the different miracles Jesus performed. Through this children can begin to think of how Jesus can help them, just like he helped others.

PE - Dance/Team Games

Year 1 will be starting with dance as their indoor lesson and learning about how to create dance routines. Also additional lessons will consist of the various athletics events as well as continuing with fielding skills.

Music - Singing a key focus.

We will be continuing to sing a variety of topic based songs adding tuned and un-tuned percussion instruments.
