School Recovery 'Catch Up' Strategy

The children at SJF have missed out on several months of direct teaching and the direct instructions in developing the skills required to become independent readers, writers and Mathematicians.

This academic year, there will be a focus particularly on English - Reading and Writing and Maths. In English we will focus on phonics, decoding, comprehension and reading for fun. We will also focus on independent writing across the school. In Maths we will focus on basic maths operations and times tables. We will, from March 2021 (When/If children return to school) to the Easter holidays have an increased proportion of the daily timetable committed to Maths and English.

Another key concern is the social and emotional health of our children - as all year groups have missed out on opportunities for their own personal development. As part of our Catch Up we will be concentrating on basic academic skills that transfer across the curriculum and Emotional Well-being.
